In the Hanthana foothills

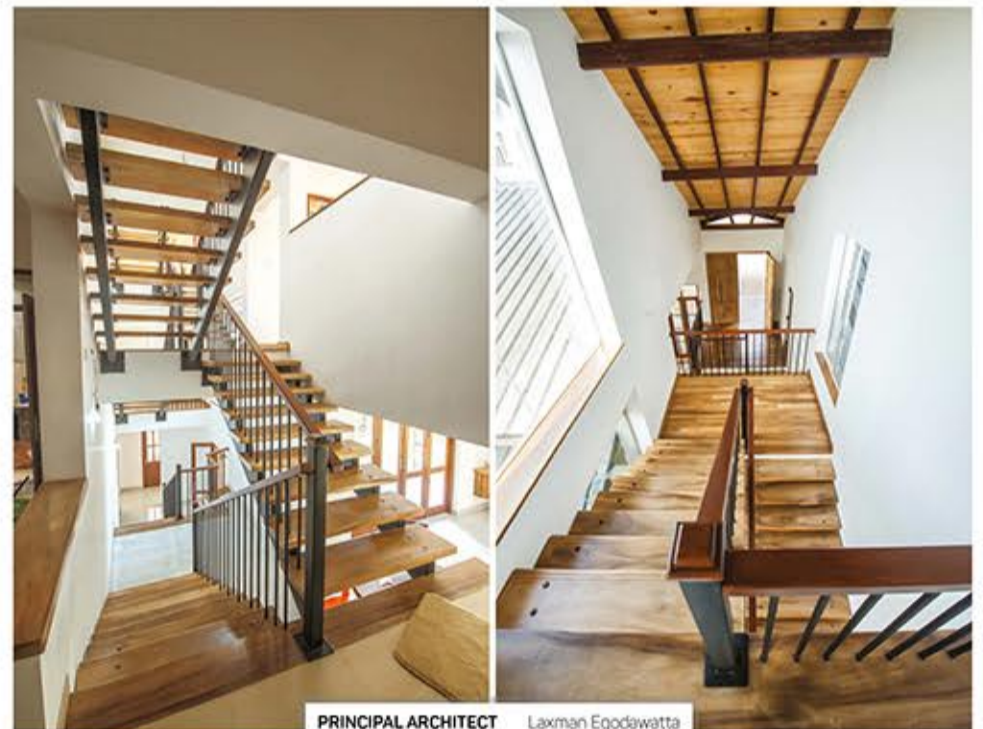
Located in the foothills of the beautiful Hanthana Mountain Range, this family home has been designed around the concepts of functionality, privacy and communication. Built on 15 perches of sloping land and spanning 3,200 sq ft, the house – which is divided into zones through split levels – consists of four bedrooms and three bathrooms. A unique feature of the home is the central staircase, which is aligned with the main entrance. It continues as a single uninterrupted path through the entire structure and provides exclusive access to all the spaces so that every zone has its own split-level entry directly by using the stairway. This makes access more efficient, gives each space a definite sense of functionality and also preserves privacy by eliminating unnecessary cross travel between spaces. The staircase sports an open design, which allows for maximum light and ventilation – and more importantly, a high degree of visual transparency through the structure. Since the stairway is an important communication route between the various spaces, it's an integral part of the home.. not only as a navigational structure but also a dynamic component that brings together all the zones in the house.
